OUR FOUNDING PRESIDENT:

"The technical man must not be lost in his own technology; he must be able to appreciate life, and life is art, drama, music, and most importantly, people." - Dr. Fazlur Rahman Khan

Dr. Fazlur Rahman Khan was a Bangladeshi American structural engineer and architect who lived and worked in Chicago. He is world renowned for his invention of tubular structural systems and other systems for building skyscrapers. His engineering inventions influenced the design and construction of tall buildings all over the world, including the previous World Trade Center in New York and the Burj Khalifa in Dubai. His most famous buildings in Chicago are the Willis Tower (formerly Sears Tower) and the John Hancock Center.

There are several other buildings in Chicago which were also designed by him. In the U.S., he designed the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado, and the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Internationally, he designed the award winning Hajj Terminal in King Abdulaziz International Airport in Saudi Arabia. In addition, he designed notable buildings in Bangladesh and Melbourne, Australia.

He pioneered the concept of a sky deck or lobby at the top of skyscrapers, and using computers in structural engineering architecture.

He was born on April 3, 1929 in Dhaka, but was brought up in Faridpur. He went to Armanitola Government High School in Dhaka. He did his undergraduate work at the Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology, Calcutta University (formerly Bengal Engineering College) in Shibpur, and received his Bachelor of Civil Engineering from Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET - formerly Ahsanullah Engineering College, Dhaka University). He received a Fulbright Scholarship and a Pakistan government scholarship, and came to the U.S. to study at University of Illinois at the Urbana Champaign campus (UIUC). He earned two master's degrees in only three years, one in structural engineering and one in theoretical and applied mechanics. He was employed by Skidmore, Owings and Merrill, one of the largest architectural firms in the world, right after and was made partner eleven years later and then general partner. He also went on to receive his PhD in structural engineering. In addition, he received Honorary Doctorates from Northwestern University, Lehigh University and Swiss Federal Institute of Technology, Zurich.

During his career, he received numerous awards and honors for his seminal work in structural engineering. He passed away from a heart attack on March 27, 1982, in Jeddah, and was brought to Chicago for burial. Dr. Khan's personal papers, are held by the Ryerson & Burnham Libraries at the Art Institute of Chicago. The Fazlur Khan Collection includes manuscripts, sketches, audio cassette tapes, slides and other materials regarding his work.

Remembering the Memories of the Past - Mouyid Bin Islam

After leaving my motherland, the most adorable memories that come to my mind are my family – father, mother, my siblings and close friends. These memories become more distinct and significant especially on celebrations such as Eid, many cultural festivals, and social and political holidays. In addition, the memories of living in the Bangladesh Academy for Rural Development (BARD) campus in Comilla, makes me want to fly back to those golden moments. Anyone living outside of his or her motherland will agree that those memories back home are always melodious and incomparable to our busy life in the United States (U.S.). How many of us reflect on those childhood memories in the daily monotonous moments abroad? However, the social aspect of life in the foreign countries are about living and enjoying special moments closely with family, relatives, and friends from school and/or college. These social gatherings get more enjoyable and immensely celebratory on big holidays such as Memorial Day, Labor Day, Independence Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas day followed by New Year's Eve in the U.S.

The memories that keep coming back to me during major holidays such as February 21st – International Mother Language Day, March 26th – the Independence Day, and December 16th – the Victory Day, makes me feel like a proud Bangladeshi. When I was a young child, I remember waking up early morning to join the parade (probhat feri) singing the patriotic song – "amar bhai-er rokte rangano – ekushe february, amiki bhuli-te pari." I still remember my father used to keep us awake in the early morning to walk barefoot with him to join the parade, holding flowers in our tiny small hands and walking around campus until we offered the flowers at the designated monument (similar to "martyr tomb") inside BARD campus. That day was ironically special to us (my younger sister and I) because I would count time when we would come back home and able to sleep back to compensate for early morning wake-up in the winter month of February. Nonetheless, as I grew up, I started realizing the significance of waking up early morning and holding the flowers to honor the sacrifice of our brave brothers and sisters in 1952 during those protests against the political decisions made by the leaders of West Bengal. I do not think these memories would come back to me till today unless my father, being a freedom fighter of 1971 liberation war, would encourage us from the early age to participate in those great national days. Moreover, living inside BARD, we grew up in a more culturally conscious community that was actively involved in celebrating these events with patriotic songs, dramas, and poems through the participation of people of all ages. Standing at this instant in my life, my memories always keep me conscious about those days and strongly appreciate my father. He taught us that value and appreciation being the next generation of a freedom fighter. In the past, being in the graduate school in the U.S., I tried to attend the cultural rehearsals and complete programs at Purdue campus. I still cherish those great memories back home and here in two different dimensions.

The decisions and opportunities have led us to reinvent our identity being Bangladeshi, our communal strength and cherish our memories in our busy life. Like many other Bangladeshis, I also moved from Bangladesh to start a new chapter in life and embrace the positive change in life by pursuing higher education that leads to a better quality of life. I have noticed the vast differences here in comparison to the life in Bangladesh. In the U.S., people have the mindset that everything can be attained by materialistic attainment, whereas, that is not true in my understanding. I believe there are some things that are undoubtedly priceless in our life. Being able to spend time with family, friends and creating memorable experiences is more important than materialistic gains. Would we not stop for a moment and think progressively?

In order to create a balance between the Bangladeshi and American cultures, we, as a society, have to re-unite people by bringing different generations of people together through our own glorious history. We need to take the necessary steps to implement cultural synthesis by strengthening a collective social value through the effective cultural and social programs. This will enable all people to have an avenue for their individual expressions and participation. We need to become alive with our Bangladeshi cultural songs, dances, dramas, parades and food stalls for all to see and enjoy and become unified through well-organized programs by Bangladesh Association of Chicagoland.
